In the law schools

The John Marshall Law School announced that it will now offer a J.D. Certificate in Sustainability Law through its Center for Real Estate Law.

The new certificate will allow law students to focus on the area of sustainability and its connection to real estate, transactional and regulatory work.

The sustainability certificate curriculum requires students to take courses in energy, environmental and local government law as well real estate transactions.

The law school said **Fred P. Bosselman**, a professor emeritus at IIT Chicago-Kent College of Law, and **Mark E. Burkland**, a partner at Holland & Knight LLP, will teach a course in the spring about energy development projects using three cases studies.
